Less than two years after William T. Innes began publishing his "AQUARIUM" magazine (May,1932) a similar magazine with the same title appeared in Paris, France, edited by Maurice Guittard. It started in January, 1934, and was published monthly by Imp. de l'Edition et de l'Industrie, 7 Av. Verdier, Montrouge (Seine),(in French).

This attractive 16 page periodical contained informative articles popular in the hobby at the time. Regular features included: Beginners Page; Abstracts from German magazines; Questions and answers; Society notices; and Book reviews. Numerous articles by familiar U.S. authors, such as, W.T.Innes, G.S.Myers, and F.H.Stoye appeared in translation.

Covers began as line drawings printed in two colors (black and green on white), however, by issue #3 black/white photographs were utilized. Beginning with December, 1934, (#12) through January, 1936, (#25) full color photos by W.T.Innes aborned the covers. The last ten issues returned to black and white perhaps due to the increasing financial difficulties of the magazine. An index to Vol. I was supplied in January, 1935, (#13) and to Vol. II in December, 1935, (#24) but unfortunately no index to the incomplete Vol. III was offered.

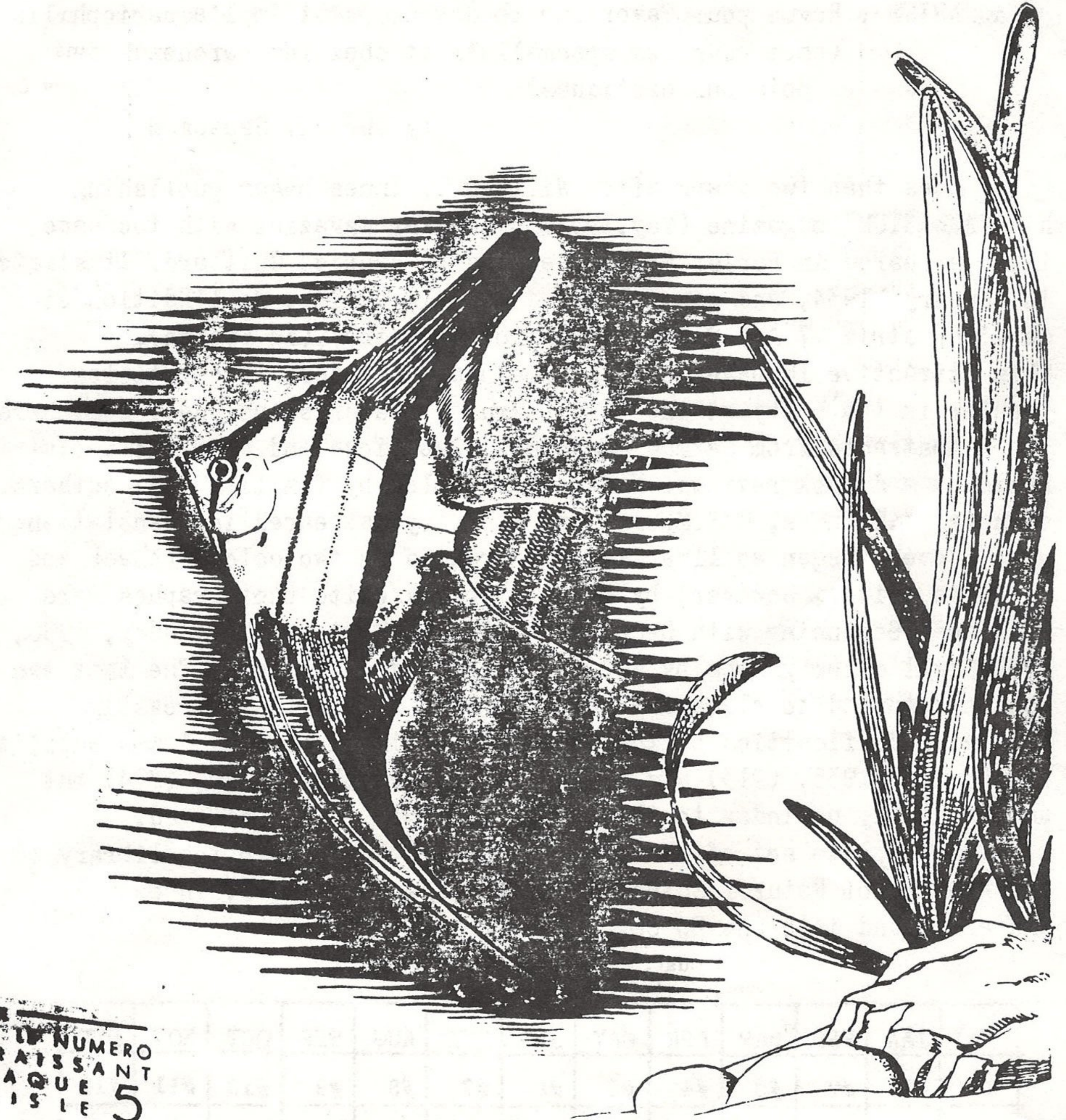
A complete set of these magazines was donated to the library of the Academy of Natural Science, Philadelphia, by Wm. T. Innes and are bound into one 28 cm. volume.

As collectors of aquarium literature we are all somewhere down the line faced with the experience where some rare or used book dealer attempts to sell us an old aquarium book. Many times, unless he is a very reputable and honest book dealer, we do not have any idea as to the real condition of the book we are buying. Sometimes the fault lies with ourselves in that we do not understand what the dealer means when he rates the books condition he wishes to sell as " Mint ", " Very Good ", " Good+", or " Good ".

After forty years of purchasing historical literature and aquarium book through the mail, you will forgive me if I make an observation. Many book dealers themselves do not know how to rate their books when they offer them to each other. You would be surprised to know that this is a serious problem among the members of the " book trade ".

Fortunately; there are dealers in this country who have started a serious campaign to prevent such unfortunate misunderstandings between book dealers and their customers. Such a book dealer is my friend, Joe Wilcox of Albion, Michigan, who has been kind enough to permit me to use his rating system to instruct the membership of CAL in a worthy effort to prevent such misunderstandings. If we can establish a standard, among ourselves and those of the book trade who supply us with aquarium literature, then we will all benefit with superior libraries of our aquarium literature. In this first of two articles we will attempt to outline such a rating system, using Joe Wilcox succinct definitions of these ratings, in our attempt to stabilize book descriptions in the trade for use of Collectors of Aquarium Literature.

" STANDARDS FOR EVALUATING BOOK CONDITIONS OF AQUARIUM LITERATURE "

- " MINT " Seldom correctly used. Means Exactly, and we mean exactly, as issued by the publisher. Even if the book has been inscribed by the author to another party, it is no longer Mint. Dust jackets must be present and immaculate, and books overall virgo intacta, and innocent as Adam and Eve ante Serpent.
- " VERY FINE " As Mint, but the price may be cut from the dust jacket, and may have been deflowered by actually having been read, a condition abhorred by many collectors.
- " FINE " No visible wear, but inscriptions, names, small stamps, etc., are admissible. No actual wear.

" VERY GOOD " Beginning to look like the rest of us, but still better. Entirely intact, nothing missing, no cover fading, splotches, torn endpapers, etc:

" GOOD + " Not up to Very Good but still better than Good, a bit above the average well used and read book.

" GOOD " Average used condition, but with us intact, no missing endpapers, plates, etc:, ordinary wear, evidence of having been read and liked, sticky fingers, Scotch glass rings, underlined passages and marginalia, fading, sunning, etc:

" FAIR " Shaken, missing endpapers but not plates, [illustrations bound in, usually glossy stock and printed one side only] text must be all present.

" POOR " Lousy, missing pages. Rescued ex post facto from the Black Hole of Calcutta. Assaulted by apprentice librarians with stamps, pockets, cheap rebindings, endpapers untimely ripped, and revenge for a low city budget.

" READING COPY " See " Fair ". Patronizing term for a book which is meant to be read until a better one appears which won't. Good buzz phrase in the book business. With us, all book club editions are reading copies.

With collectors of aquarium literature all of the following imperfections must be revealed. Chief among these faults is rubbing or scraping to the extremities-- the edges of covers, and the joints where covers meet the spines. The degree of wear will determine the rating. You can call a book " Fine " if there's rubbing to the corners, but if the wear is so minor that you need to squint at it closely in strong light, then by all means accept the dealers line "[" light rubbing to corners"] and add " otherwise fine ". If extreme wear is obvious then a dealer should not rate it higher than " Very Good ".

Always, always; the dealer should let you know the following traits.

- * Clippings and other papers pasted into endpapers.
- * cracked and broken hinges.
- * cover and spine fading and staining.
- * torn pages, maps and plates.
- * missing illustrations, endpapers and flyleaves.
- * spotting to pages and plates.
- * damaged by animals, bugs, children, and WATER .
- * tears to spine ends.
- * split joints
- * missing title labels from spine or front cover.
- * warped spine and bowed covers
- * soiling to covers or pages [including fingerprints]
- * tattered dust jackets

As collectors of aquarium literature how can we use these nine rating terms to keep from being taken by some lazy bookdealer who is not doing his homework or trying to pass off an inferior book at an inflated price. It may be to our advantage to set up a committee to aid our membership in reducing these rating terms down to a simple card or 5 1/2 X 8 1/2 sheet of paper to cover the imperfections that the dealer doesn't mention. Then; when we receive a quote from a dealer, we can mail back the card or sheet and ask the dealer to take a better look at the book he is trying to sell, and evaluate if the price fits the condition of the book.

Do not hesitate to use this system for purchasing aquarium literature. A reputable dealer will be happy to back up his description; while a dealer who has been inaccurate will protect his reputation by taking a better look at what he is offering for sale. Remember; in the book trade; when advertising costs a half a buck to seventy cents per line to advertise a book, many dealers feel they can not describe a book. However; if you send along a SASE envelope, it has been my experience that with a descriptive card or sheet such as I am advising we establish, all dealers will cooperate in describing the condition on the sheet or at the bottom of your letter of inquiry. As a buyer you may not care whether a book has an imperfection or not; but you certainly would appreciate knowing ahead of time. In this way you will find you have a much better idea of just what you are buying for your money.

Next issue we will attempt to use this system to evaluate the conditions of the magazines we trade or purchase from dealers and from other members of the hobby and CAL.

TE comments ; just delighted to have these clear and authoritative articles by Mr. Steve Stewart. We would all be well advised to try to follow his guidelines as they are excellent. For those of you who are sloppy by nature (I am) frequently pressed for time (I am) and have been known to NOT leaf thru anything I trade or sell as completely as I should I would like to suggest a policy I have followed for years. Anything and everything I sell or trade is returnable without any reason or explanation and I will pay postage both ways. This should be done in a reasonable amount of time.

Five years ago when I first began collecting fish magazines the first that was of interest to me was Tropical Fish Hobbyist. I would guess that most collectors probably started off seeking the same. Tropical Fish Hobbyist which will be referred to as TFH was first printed in September of 1952. It was first printed in a small format and in November of 1981 it was changed to it's present size. I believe it has brought more fish to the hobbyist than any other magazine.

When the idea first came to me to collect magazines I had quite a number of TFH due to the fact that I had been in the fish hobby for over twenty years. Unfortunately I did not keep all of the magazines that I had been reading during this time. Upon completion of the inventory of the magazines that I did have, I realized that I could complete everything from 1960 to the current date. I then managed to trade for the entire year of 1959 and I was able to get a few from 1952 thru 1958. I then ran into a dead end. I was really frustrated. At that time I did not know of anyone who was collecting magazines. I began calling several fish friends and I was soon pointed in the direction of some magazine collectors.

My next discovery was that other people were having the same difficulty in locating the magazines as I was. I also soon learned that if anything was available I was going to have to buy a complete set. I could understand this because if the set was broken up to sell only the difficult one's the owner would be put in the same position that I was in.

Being an impatient person and not knowing if I could complete a set especially with the limited people who were collecting, I bought a complete set. This was very expensive and while being well worth it, I was left with an almost complete second set.

Not realizing at the time the different sets of magazines that were available to the hobby I put aside my second set of TFH to concentrate on collecting as many of the other sets as possible. While doing this I retained a burning desire to complete my second set of TFH. As I began to accumulate the other magazines I also began to accumulate many new friends and thru them I was able to complete my second set of TFH. I was even able to go as far as improving my second set so that I now have a near mint complete second set.

Fishes of Sahul

Recently, I received volume one numbers one and two of this publication. Each issue included a newsletter concerning business matters and request help in obtaining new members. The first issue has a four page article on Melanotaenia trifasciata with six color photographs beautifully picturing varieties from six different rivers. The article provides comprehensive information on keeping this species in an aquarium. The next article describes Galaxiella pusilla in the wild. The four page article also includes a great color photograph of the species plus a list of references for further study. The last article describes the Shannon Mud Minnow, Lepidogalaxias salamandroides. Both line drawings accurately depict the male and female of the species.

The second issue begins with an article by Gerald R. Allan on Chilatherina bufolo that covers three pages. The author lists his reasons for distinguishing this species from C. Crassispinosa. The article includes several drawings and photographs that picture the collecting sites. The next article describes a beautiful desert goby, Chlamydogobius eremius by Graham Thompson. This four page article includes many insights into keeping this species in an aquarium. Another four pages are devoted to four brief articles dealing with Australian native fishes. The one article on drying rainbow eggs like killifish eggs is must reading.
